PROPOSED TRAFFIC CALMING MEASURES SECTION 38 OF THE ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1994

In accordance with the provisions of Section 38 of the Road Traffic Act 1994, Kildare County Council hereby gives notice of its intention of:

Mill Street Active Travel Scheme, Maynooth, from the Main Street junction to the Kilcock Road junction comprising of:

- Provision of protected segregated cycle tracks on both sides of the carriageway and localised revised cycle track layout.
- Provision of shared surfaces, as per locations shown on the Section 38 drawings.
- Provision of signalised toucan crossings on all arms of Main Street junction and outside of the Manor Mills shopping centre.
- Provision of raised crossing on Pound Lane side road to prioritise pedestrian movements and for additional safety to vulnerable road users.
- Provision of two (2) new bus stops as part of a new bus route (Tallaght to North Maynooth - Route W6). Provision of a bus shelter at the bus stop on the southbound carriageway.
- Relocation of the existing (2 bay) taxi rank from the north of William Bridge alongside the northbound carriageway to the south of William Bridge alongside the northbound carriageway.
- Removal of six (6) on street parking spaces to accommodate protected segregated cycle and pedestrian infrastructure.
- Provision of periodic loading bay and two (2) car parking spaces between Pound Lane and the Main Street junction. Loading bay between 08:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. and monitored parking spaces between 11:30 a.m. and 8:30 p.m.

EDUCATION BURSARY SCHEMES FOR 2023

Kildare County Council Announces Three Education Bursary Schemes For 2023

Kildare County Council is awarding three bursaries, which are designed to provide an opportunity to study at third level, to persons who may not be in a position to undertake a course of study because of serious disadvantage or disability. These bursaries are as follows:

1. The William G. Carroll Bursary is mainly, but not exclusively, for third level courses in the field of community development.
2. The Kildare Education Bursary for people with disabilities is for any third level course.
3. The Kildare County Council Memorial Bursary for DEIS schools is for any third level course being undertaken by a former pupil of a DEIS school.

Applications are invited from persons living in County Kildare who wish to undertake a degree course at a recognised third level institution in Ireland. The course being undertaken should be at undergraduate level. Bursaries are not normally available for post-Leaving Certificate courses or post-graduate courses, but applications will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

Qualifying for a SUSI grant will not act as a bar to the award of a bursary.
