# NOTICE OF PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT Proposed development of a Welfare/Training/Workshop Facility at Gallowshill, Athy, Co. Kildare

Planning Ref. P82020.01

Pursuant to the requirements of the above, Kildare County Council proposes to develop a Welfare/ Training/Workshop/Facility at Gallowshill, Athy, Co. Kildare. This development, which is the subject of this Part 8, will include the following:

The construction of a single storey training / workshop facility to include welfare facilities consisting of a canteen, changing facilities / toilets and an office with associated parking and all associate site works. This application also includes an Appropriate Assessment screening report and an Ecological Impact Assessment report

Plans and particulars of the proposed development will be available for inspection or purchase at a fee not exceeding the reasonable cost of making a copy during normal opening hours from Tuesday, 7 July 2020 to Wednesday, 5 August 2020, during public opening hours at the following locations:

The proposed development has undergone **Appropriate Assessment Screening** under the Habitats Directive (92/43/EEC), the Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended, and the European Communities (Bird and Natural Habitats) Regulations 2011-2015. Kildare County Council has determined that an Appropriate Assessment is not required. The proposed development, individually or in combination with other plans or projects, will not have a significant effect on a European Site.

In addition, the proposal has also undergone screening for Environmental Impact Assessment under the EIA Directive 2011/92/EU as amended by Directive 2014/52/EU, (and the relevant provisions of the Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended and the Planning and Development Regulations 2001, as amended) and Kildare County Council has determined that there is no real likelihood of significant effects on the environment arising from the proposed development and that an Environmental Impact Assessment is not required.

In accordance with Article 120 of the Planning and Development Regulations 2001 (as amended), any person may, at any time before the expiration of 4 weeks beginning on the date of this notice, apply to An Bord Pleanála for a screening determination as to whether the proposed development would be likely to have significant effects on the environment.

# TEMPORARY ROAD WORKS SPEED LIMIT ORDER ADVISORY NOTICE

### M4 Eastbound

# in the townlands of Kilmacredock, Grangewilliam, Moneycooley

Kildare County Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 10 of the Road Traffic Act 2004, hereby makes the following Order in respect of the area comprising the administrative County of Kildare;

- 1. This order may be cited as the Road Works Speed Limit Order NRO
- 60 kilometres per hour shall be the Road Works Speed Limit for mechanically propelled vehicles on the Roads as specified in the First Schedule to this order;
- 3. 80 kilometres per hour shall be the Road Works Speed Limit for mechanically propelled vehicles on the Roads as specified in the Second Schedule to this order;

#### First Schedul

Roads in respect of which a Road Works Speed Limit Order of 60 kilometres per hour is prescribed;

A section of M4 in the townlands of Kilmacredock, Grangewilliam, Moneycooley

#### M4 Eastbound

- Part of the Eastbound M4 between a point 295 metres east of the existing Junction 8 East overbridge to a point 1050 metres east of the existing Junction 7 (R406) overbridge (Total 8,000m in length).
- Part of the Eastbound M4 merge at Junction 8 from a point 135 metres east of the start of the merge on-ramp at M4 Junction 8 to the end of the merge taper (Total 585m in length).
- Part of the Eastbound M4 diverge at Junction 7 from the start of the diverge taper to a point on the diverge ramp 95 metres west of the stop line of the diverge off-ramp at Junction 7 (Total 465m in length).
- Part of the Eastbound M4 merge at Junction 7 from a point 120 metres east of the start of the merge on-ramp at M4 Junction 7 to the end of the merge taper (Total 550m in length).

### Second Schedule

Roads in respect of which a Road Works Speed Limit Order of 80 kilometres per hour is prescribed;

A section of M4 in the townlands of Kilmacredock, Grangewilliam,
Moneycooley

### M4 Eastbound

Part of the Eastbound M4 between a point 55 metres west of the
existing Junction 8 West overbridge to a point 295 metres east of the
existing Junction 8 East overbridge (Total 500m in length).

An Garda Síochána and Transport Infrastructure Ireland have indicated that they have no objections to this Road Works Speed Limit Order.

This Road Works Speed Limit Order will apply from Tuesday, 7 July 2020 to Friday, 7 August 2020 inclusive.

# TEMPORARY CLOSING OF ROADS NOTICE OF INTENTION ROADS ACT, 1993 – ROADS REGULATIONS, 1994

Kildare County Council gives notice in accordance with Section 75 of the Roads Act, 1993 and the Roads Regulations, 1994, that it intends to close the following public road:

- The L6006 (Canal Road, Naas) between its junction with the L2006 (Osberstown Road, Naas) at Osberstown Bridge and its junction with L2996 (Mill Lane, Naas) at Tandy's Bridge.
- The L2996 (Canal Road, Naas) between its junction with the L6006 (Mill Lane, Naas) at Tandy's Bridge and its junction with the L29962 (Abbey Road, Naas) at Abbey Bridge.

Dates of closure will be each Sunday on the following dates:

2 August 2020 9 August 2020 16 August 2020 23 August 2020 30 August 2020 6 September 2020 13 September 2020 20 September 2020 27 September 2020 4 October 2020

The closure is required to facilitate pedestrian and cyclist movement at this location.

## Alternative Routes

Traffic moving south will be diverted along the L2006 (Osberstown Road) to the R407 (Sallins Road) and onto the R445 (Main Street, Naas).

Traffic moving north will be diverted along the R445 (Main Street, Naas) onto the R407 (Sallins Road) and onto the L2006 (Osberstown Road).

Diversionary routes will be clearly signposted, as agreed with the Council and An Garda Síochána. Emergency access and restricted local access will be maintained.
