That's the motto of the annual Jamie "Smiley" Donohoe Memorial Golf Classic, which returns to Newbridge Golf Club on Saturday, June 1.

The charity tournament is organised in memory of the Newbridge teenager who died in a tragic car accident 15 years ago.

Jamie passed away on March 10 2007 at the young age of just 16.

"Known as Smiley to all because of his happy demeanour and never without a smile, Jamie was generous and kind. He charitably donated €50 of his communion money to St. Brigid's hospice on the Curragh, something he did on his own without any suggestions for family or friends," said his family.

Jamie's anniversary his cousin Kevin Donohoe suggested running a one-off golf memorial event to remember Jamie with the proceeds going to St Brigid's Hospice.

The event was a great success and Jamie's family decided to run the event again the following year.

Thanks to the support and generosity of the public the event grew in strength, and 16 years on it has raised over €50,000 for various charities in Jamie's name, including St. Brigid's Hospice, Make A Wish Foundation, Newbridge Oblate ·Lourdes Group, Injured Jockeys Association, The Dining Table in Newbridge, Jumping Jellybeans Milltown, Kildare Jumping Down Syndrome Association, Lynn Children's Laura Hospice, The Newbridge Samaritans, Patrician Secondary School Breakfast, where Jamie was a student at the time of his passing.

Irish pub. He is organising a charity darts tournament this year to coincide with Jamie's Golf Classic. All teams in the league have agreed to in the charity tournament which will be held in Lynch's Irish pub.
