Location to the south west of Carnalway crossroads






Detached three-bay to front five-bay to side, single-storey thatched "gentleman's residence", c.1800, facing west with a front porch and a range of stone ourbuildings to the north arranged around a farm yard. Sited within landscaped grounds with avenue entered through decorative cast-iron gates; enclosed by rubble stone walls; with mature beech trees. Hipped oaten thatch roof to the front pitch and south side. Corrugated sheeting to the inner pirches. Natural slare to the north wing. Thatched 2003 with a platted ridge and four large rendered chimneystacks; octagonal clay pots. Formally proportioned window openings with original sashes. Replacement timber door with recrangular overlight. To the rear of the south wing is a plank timber door opening into a small courryard.


