If your dog or cat are not already microchipped it is a timely opportunity to do this before Halloween. Fireworks cause animals to run and they can quickly cover long distances and become disorientated. When chipped they can be found, identified and returned to the safety of their homes again.

It is a simple procedure involving the injection of an electronic device which is the size of a grain of rice, under the skin between the shoulder blades. Each pet has a unique number which can be scanned.

By law all dogs including newborn pups must be microchipped, registered and

certified. It is not currently compulsory to chip a cat but it is very worthwhile to do it.

PROPOSED TRAFFIC CALMING MEASURES
SECTION 38 OF THE ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1994

In accordance with the provisions of Section 38 of the Road Traffic Act 1994, Kildare County Council hereby gives notice of its intention of:

Kilcullen Road R448 Proposed Cycle and Pedestrian Improvements, from Ballymore Road/Kilcullen Road junction to Fairgreen Street/Newbridge Road junction (Murtagh's Corner) comprising of:

- Installation of protected segregated cycle tracks on both sides of the carriageway from Ballymore Road/Kilcullen Road junction to Fairgreen Street/Newbridge Road junction (Murtagh's Corner).
- Installation of a continuously raised footpath and cycle track across Corban's Lane and St. Michael's Terrace for additional safety to vulnerable road users.
- Removal of nine (9) on street parking spaces to accommodate protected segregated cycle and pedestrian infrastructure from Ballymore Road/Kilcullen Road junction to Fairgreen Street/Newbridge Road junction (Murtagh's Corner).
- Installation of a raised junction table and pedestrian crossing point at Kilcullen Road/Corban's Lane junction.
