**TEMPORARY CLOSING OF ROADS
NOTICE OF DECISION
ROADS ACT, 1993 – ROADS REGULATIONS, 1994**

Kildare County Council, on behalf of Irish Water, gives notice in accordance with Section 75 of the Roads Act, 1993 and the Roads Regulations, 1994 that it will close the following roads during the period commencing **Wednesday, 10 February 2021 to Tuesday, 23 March 2021** to facilitate the installation of pipework.

Planned works are programmed for 42 calendar days. Advance notification of start date will be provided. Roads will be opened early if works are completed early.

Alternative Routes:

Westbound vehicles travelling on the L4079 (Athgarvan Road) towards the R445 (Edward Street) will divert right at L4079 (Athgarvan Road)/L70419 (Cutlery Road) (circa 0.33km). They will then divert left at L70419 (Cutlery Road)/R445 (Edward Street) and continue on the R445 (Edward Street) (circa 0.63km).

Eastbound vehicles travelling on the R445 (Edward Street) towards Newbridge Shopping Centre car park will instead continue straight on the R445 (Edward Street) (circa 0.63km). They will then divert right before Conleth's Bridge onto the R416 Athgarvan Road.

Diversions routes will be clearly signposted, as agreed with the Council and An Garda Síochána. Emergency access and restricted local access will be maintained.

Vehicles travelling on from the graveyard side will have to follow a signed diversion through Lucan village and back to the N4 into Leixlip village.

Vehicles travelling along Confey train station side will have to follow a signed diversion through Leixlip village and back to the N4 and into Lucan village and then out the R149.

**Monasterevin Bridge Remediation Works
Application to An Bord Pleanála**

Kildare County Council hereby publishes this notice of its intention to carry out remediation works on Monasterevin Bridge, a protected structure (Kildare County Council Record of Protected Structures Reference: B26-38) which is located within the River Barrow and River Nore Special Area of Conservation (SAC). Remediation works arise from damage to the bridge caused by scouring. Monasterevin Bridge is an early nineteenth century bridge structure that is on the primary entrance road the R445 on the western side of the town.

The works will consist of:

- Remedial repair works to piers and cutwater: Works will require removal of defective sections of the concrete cutwater, dismantling displaced masonry, grouting voids, reinstatement of displaced masonry and renewal of concrete cutwater.
- Localised vegetation removal and pointing of opening joints. Dismantling will be carried out to remove embedded roots.
- Rock armour protection to the east embankment of the river.

Notice is hereby given that Kildare County Council proposes to seek approval of An Bord Pleanála for the proposed works under Section 177AE (4) (a) of the Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended (as inserted by Section 57 the Planning and Development (Amendment) Act 2010).

A Natura Impact Statement (NIS) has been prepared in respect of the proposed works.

An Bord Pleanála may give approval to the application with or without conditions or may refuse the application.

- the implications of the proposed development for proper planning and sustainable development in the area concerned,
- the likely effects on the environment of the proposed development, and
- the likely significant effects of the proposed development on a European site, if carried out.

Any submissions or observations must be received by An Bord Pleanála not later than close of business on Friday, 19 March 2021.

A person may question the validity of any such decision by the Board by way of an application for a judicial review under Order 84 of the Rules of the Superior Courts (S.I. no. 15 of 1986) in accordance with Section 50 of the Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended.
