TEMPORARY CLOSING OF ROADS NOTICE OF DECISION

ROADS ACT, 1993 – ROADS REGULATIONS, 1994

Kildare County Council gives notice in accordance with Section 75 of the Roads Act, 1993 and the Roads Regulations, 1994 that it will close the following roads during the period commencing **Tuesday, 3 August 2021 to Friday, 13 August 2021** to facilitate road resurfacing.

Planned works are programmed for **5 calendar days**. Advance notification of start date will be provided. Roads will be opened early if works are completed early.

Alternative Routes:

HGV's / PSV's

Eastbound vehicles approaching the closure on this road from the R157 Maynooth-Dunboyne Road will be diverted west back to the R157 towards Maynooth then east on to the R148 Maynooth-Leixlip Road.

Westbound vehicles approaching the closure from the R149 Lucan-Clonee Road will be diverted east back to the R149 towards Lucan, through Lucan Village then west on the N4 to Leixlip.

All Other Vehicles

Eastbound vehicles approaching the closure on this road from the R157 Maynooth-Dunboyne Road will be diverted south on the L1014 (Kellystown Lane), then east on the R148 towards Leixlip, then north at Leixlip Main St. on to Captain's Hill (R149).

Westbound vehicles approaching the closure from the R149 Lucan-Clonee Road will be diverted south on the R149 (Captain's Hill), then west on to Leixlip Main St. (R148) towards Maynooth, then north at Blacklion on to the R157.

Diversions routes will be clearly signposted, as agreed with the Council and An Garda Síochána. Emergency access and restricted local access will be maintained.

TEMPORARY CLOSING OF ROADS NOTICE OF INTENTION

ROADS ACT, 1993 – ROADS REGULATIONS, 1994

Kildare County Council, on behalf of Irish Water, gives notice in accordance with Section 75 of the Roads Act, 1993 and the Roads Regulations, 1994 that it intends to close the following roads during the period commencing **Monday, 09 August 2021 to Friday, 03 September 2021** to facilitate permanent reinstatement of the road.

Planned works are programmed for **2 calendar days**. Advance notification of start date will be provided. Roads will be opened early if works are completed early.

Alternative Routes:

Southbound vehicles travelling on the R407 through Clane will divert left onto the R403. They will take the second exit on the roundabout and continue along the Clane Inner Relief Road.

Northbound vehicles travelling on the R407 towards Clane Main Street will be diverted right at the roundabout and continue along the Clane Inner Relief Road (circa 0.8km). At the northern roundabout they will divert left and continue along the R403 (circa 0.4km).

Vehicles travelling eastbound on the R403 towards Clane will require back feeding. They will be diverted left at the L2002. They will continue along the L2002. They will then be diverted left on the R407 towards Clane.

Vehicles travelling westbound on the R403 Celbridge Road towards Clane will be diverted left at the Clane Inner Relief Road Roundabout. They will continue along the Clane Inner Relief Road (circa 0.8km).

Diversions routes will be clearly signposted, as agreed with the Council and An Garda Síochána. Emergency access and restricted local access will be maintained.

TEMPORARY CLOSING OF ROADS NOTICE OF DECISION

ROADS ACT, 1993 – ROADS REGULATIONS, 1994

Kildare County Council gives notice in accordance with Section 75 of the Roads Act, 1993 and the Roads Regulations, 1994, that it will close the following public road.

The L6006 (Canal Road, Naas) between its junction with the L2006 (Osberstown Road, Naas) at Osberstown Bridge and its junction with L2996 (Mill Lane, Naas) at Tandy's Bridge.

The L2996 (Canal Road, Naas) between its junction with the L6006 (Mill Lane, Naas) at Tandy's Bridge and its junction with the L29962 (Abbey Road, Naas) at Abbey Bridge.

Dates of closure will be:

Every Sunday from 08 August, 2021 to 07 August, 2022, inclusive.

The closure is required to facilitate pedestrian and cyclist movement at this location.

Alternative Routes

Traffic moving south will be diverted along the L2006 (Osberstown Road) to the R407 (Sallins Road) and onto the R445 (Main Street, Naas).

Traffic moving north will be diverted along the R445 (Main Street, Naas) onto the R407 (Sallins Road) and onto the L2006 (Osberstown Road).

Diversions routes will be clearly signposted, as agreed with the Council and An Garda Síochána. Emergency access and restricted local access will be maintained.

PROPOSED TRAFFIC CALMING MEASURES SECTION 38 OF THE ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1994

KILDARE TOWN TRANSPORT STRATEGY

Kildare County Council are currently developing a Transport Strategy for Kildare Town and have commissioned consultants, AECOM for this purpose. The Transport Strategy intends to address current issues, anticipate future problems in the transport network and aid in informing future land use proposals.

A 'Phase 1' public consultation survey was undertaken during June and July 2020 which gathered views from the public on transport issues in Kildare Town as well as ideas for potential solutions. This feedback helped to inform the development of the measures in the draft Transport Strategy.

Kildare County Council now wishes to invite feedback from members of the public on the specific measures contained in the draft Kildare Town Transport Strategy.

Comments will be welcomed from the public with respect to the specific measures contained in the Draft Strategy.
